APPOINTMENT OF SECRETARY PRO-TEM

In the absence of Dr. Larry Huffman, Ms. Olivero appointed Ms. Laurie Bonucci as Secretary Pro-Tem.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

It was moved by Mr. Mallery and seconded by Dr. Driscoll to approve the agenda, as presented. Motion passed by voice vote.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. Bryan Divine, representative for the Support Staff Union, noted that negotiating teams have met twice since the last board meeting – once being immediately after the last board meeting and he thanked the members of the administrative negotiating team for staying late to work out a deal. The Board will be presented with an agreement that is a compromise from the Union to try to resolve the Unfair Labor Practice charges that were discussed at the last board meeting. This agreement will be considered in closed session and he asked the board members when it is time to vote to make a motion to act on this memorandum of agreement in a popular way so that the negotiation process can move forward. He encouraged the board members to ask the

administrative bargaining team why they have no tentative agreements to bring to the Board tonight. He noted he would be available during closed session for any questions the Board may have.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Corcoran reported one of the goals IVCC's Board and he agreed to last year was to establish an endowment so that the College could offer more scholarships, particularly to those with unmet financial needs. The initial target was set at \$500,000 and Dr. Corcoran was happy to report that the goal was achieved because of 106 generous supporters of the college's mission. Thanks to Fran Brolley and his Foundation Office Team, \$512,381 was raised, which has already benefitted nearly 80 students. A few years ago 240 donors contributed to the College's capital campaign for the latest technology and equipment in the Peter Miller Community Technology Center by raising \$2.1 million. Despite the state's inability to craft a budget that prioritizes the needs of public higher education, IVCC remains true to its mission and focuses on doing everything it can to give people in its large district the opportunity to receive a first-class education at a cost that is a fraction of what it would be for a student going straight from high school to a four-year college or university. IVCC is also in the minority again by covering MAP grants in FY2017. IVCC does the right thing and lets the chips fall where they may. Both the capital campaign and steps taken to establish an endowment were firsts for IVCC and Dr. Corcoran is very proud of what has been accomplished - neither of which would have happened without lots of great people in the community, many of whom were in the room. Patty Williamson, director of financial aid, was the architect of the Tuition Assistance Program designed to benefit four specific populations of students: HSE/GED or ESL students in "bridge" programs, middle-class students who qualify for very little (if any) financial aid, returning students who want to finish up work on a certificate or degree, or returning-summer Minutes of IVCC Board Meeting September 8, 2016 Page 3

students without access to financial aid. Even though the average award has only been in the \$333-\$357 range, what these students have been able to accomplish because of the program has been impressive. In the same way as a recognition display is near the main entrance celebrating those who contributed towards the capital campaign, a similar display is planned for contributors to the endowment campaign. On behalf of the many faculty and staff who benefitted from the capital campaign, the 80 students who have received tuition assistance so that they could pursue their academic and career goals, and the generations of student who will benefit from this point forward because of the endowment, Dr. Corcoran thanked everyone for a job well done.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Mr. Mallery noted that he received notification of the recent legislation which required elected and appointed community college trustees to receive four hours of leadership training in specific legal and other subject areas during the 1st, 3rd and 5th years of their terms. The new law becomes effective on January 1, 2017 for anyone appointed or elected after January 1, 2017. Each community college district shall maintain on its website a listing of all board members who have successfully completed the training, as well as those who have not successfully completed the training. Each trustee shall certify completion of the training to the Secretary of the Board. ICCTA plans to offer a qualified four-hour training seminar for all trustees who are first elected or reelected at the April 4, 2017 election. The program is scheduled for ICCTA's June 2, 2017 annual convention in Bloomington, IL.

STAFF APPOINTMENT – DIANN JABUSCH, DIRECTOR OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SERVICES

It was moved by Mr. Solon and seconded by Ms. Bonucci to appoint Diann Jabusch as Director of Information Technology Services at an annualized salary of \$89,000. Motion passed by voice vote.

BID REQUEST - SIMULAIDS SMART STAT BASIC PATIENT SIMULATOR

It was moved by Dr. Driscoll and seconded by Ms. Goetz to seek bids for a Simulaids SMART STAT Basic patient simulator. Motion passed by voice vote.

RESOLUTION DESIGNATING DATE, TIME AND PLACE FOR FILING BOARD OF TRUSTEE NOMINATING PETITIONS

Ms. Olivero also noted that the state-mandated leadership training requires public university trustees to complete a one-time training program and community college trustees receive four hours of leadership training in specific legal and other subject areas during the 1st, 3rd and 5th years of their terms.

SUPPORT STAFF COMPENSATION MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

Due to Ms. Olivero's employment, she could not vote or handle the motion of this agreement. She turned the meeting over to Dr. Driscoll, Vice Chair. It was moved by Ms. Goetz and seconded by Mr. Solon to approve the Memorandum of Agreement, as presented. Mr. Mallery believes the agreement is fair and it got to a point where the employees who work so hard at the College will be getting their increases in pay that other employees received. He was glad the Union agreed to this and it is something that some of the Board intended on doing anyway. Motion passed by voice vote with Ms. Olivero abstaining.

The meeting was called to order at 9 a.m. by Mr. Mallery.

PROTECTION, HEALTH, AND SAFETY PROJECTS FOR TAX YEAR 2016

Three Protection, Health, and Safety (PHS) projects were chosen in preparation for the tax year 2016 levy. The first project is the replacement of the air handler/chiller in Building E at an estimate of \$1,111,745. This is a continuation of replacing the air handlers in each of the five original buildings. Age of the existing equipment justifies its replacement. The biggest challenge is the window in which to complete the project, over the winter break. Bids will be requested early next year which will allow an entire year to get everything fabricated and ready to go. The second PHS project is the replacement of the HVAC controls in Building G at an estimate of \$175,756. This project will update the building controls providing a more comfortable environment and energy savings. This work is also in preparation for replacement of the HVAC system in Building G as a future PHS project. The existing components used by the air handling units are no longer being produced and replacement parts are becoming more difficult to find. Mr. Mallery asked if it would be beneficial in replacing the controls at the same time as replacing the air handlers. The engineering firm thought this would be insignificant. The controls would transfer to the new equipment. The third project is the replacement of four overhead doors in Building J at an estimate of \$124,296. The block walls in the welding area create a safety hazard with one overhead door. The block wall runs perpendicular to the overhead door and a person can be trapped in the space between the wall and the door. Replacement is necessary to safely protect personnel. The project

will reduce the 30 ft. door to a 16 ft. door. The other three doors will be replaced to be in compliance with current safety codes. The new doors will also provide energy efficiency by having better insulation and seals.

CULTURAL CENTRE UPGRADES

The recommended upgrades to the Cultural Centre are a result of an approximate \$400,000 bequest from the estate of the late Walter Durley Boyle to be used for capital or building purposes. Mr. Boyle had a love for the College for many years and served on the Board of Trustees and also as a director of the IVCC Foundation. The project will include energy-efficient LED lighting and contemporary wood wall treatments to improve acoustics and aesthetics. The \$395,841 estimated cost for the work also includes ceiling painting, wallcoverings, handrails, and electrical and fire alarm improvements. The administration received faculty feedback from the division of Humanities, Fine Arts, and Social Sciences on their wish list for the Cultural Centre. The recommended upgrades were very well received. Dominick Demonica will be working closely with the company that recently installed a new sound system so that the acoustical properties are not reduced. Mr. Boyle's bequest reaches the level of a naming opportunity which will be done in the future.

BARN REPAIRS

The administration requested direction from the Board on making repairs to the barn located south of the main campus buildings. Total costs to reroof and paint the barn are in the range of \$66,000 to \$92,000. There was concern that the College is cutting everything else to support teaching and learning and spending this amount of money falls in the realm of poor judgment. The barn is an historical structure to many people and there will be complaints if it is taken down, but eventually that will pass. The barn needs so many improvements – structure, safety issues, continuing repairs, etc. At some point if the College does not maintain it, it will need to be taken down. Ms. Bonucci noted she would be willing to investigate options for personal or private fundraising before tearing the barn down. She would also personally create a barn quilt with the College logo and mascot. Ms. Bonucci will have a timeline for fundraising efforts at the next board meeting with an end date of December 2017.

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS – September 2016

Revenues

• As of September 30, the headcount for fall semester was 3,412, which is 158 students less than at the same point in time last year. Credit hours for fall 2016 decreased by 699, or 2.32 percent, from this point in time one year ago, for a total of 29,437. Second eight-week classes begin October 14.

Total FY2016 credit hours submitted to ICCB were 63,193, a 6.5 percent decrease from FY2015.

- On June 30, the State Legislature passed SB2047 which provided for "stopgap" funding for higher education for the first six months of fiscal year 2017 along with funding for Adult Education for FY2017 and MAP grant funds for the remaining claims for the 2015-2016 academic year. The College received the total \$862,216 for the stopgap funding and \$213,046 in MAP grant funds. There is no further information regarding Adult Education funding.
- Estimates of equalized assessed value (EAV) for tax year 2016 have been received from LaSalle and Livingston counties. LaSalle County estimates a 2.8 percent increase in EAV and Livingston estimates a 7.3 percent decrease. LaSalle County represents approximately 75 percent of the District's EAV. Livingston County represents less than two percent of the District's EAV. LaSalle County estimates increase EAV in all real property types, but a 3.8 percent increase in farm properties.

Expenditures

Fund 01 – Education Fund – Instruction – Fixed Charges – includes \$132,000 Ottawa Center annual lease payment and \$11,160 Truck Driver Training Program equipment leases;

Fund 01 – Education Fund – Academic Support – Contractual – includes Blackboard annual fee of \$75,600;

Fund 01 – Education Fund – Institutional Support – Contractual – includes legal fees of \$26,925 and Ellucian (administrative software) annual maintenance fee of \$236,000;

Fund 06 – Restricted Fund – Capital – includes a 3-D printer paid with capital campaign funds and dental assisting program equipment paid with Carl Perkins grant funds.

- O Building B Air Handler/Chiller Replacement a pre-construction meeting was held with John's Service and Sales on April 7, 2016; installation to start in December 2016; United Analytical Services performed the asbestos testing and determined that no asbestos removal is required for this project;
- o Building D Air Handler/Chiller Replacement approved by ICCB with installation planned for winter 2017;
- Lecture Hall D225 Renovation punch list items still pending but lecture hall was open for classes the first day of fall semester;
- Building E Air Handler/Chiller Replacement asking for Board approval to submit to ICCB;
- Building G Temperature Controls asking for Board approval to submit to ICCB;
- o Building J Overhead Door Replacement asking for Board approval to submit to ICCB.

Programmatic Justification

Provide an explanation of the programmatic impact of the proposed project.

The existing air cooled chiller at Building "E" was last replaced in 1996. The unit is nearing the end of its 20 year expected useful life, is starting to require additional maintenance and replacement parts are becoming more difficult to find. The College is concerned that failure of the chiller would leave Building "E" without air-conditioning for occupant comfort. In addition, the iNet protocol building automation components used by the current chiller are no longer being produced. Component production ceased on December 31, 2013. Conversion to BACnet protocol components is a priority before iNet replacement components are completely sold out.

The air handler at Building "E" was installed when the building was built in the 1970's and is past the expected years of useful life (30 years). The air handler housing has deteriorated over time. Deterioration is causing issues with fan/motor assembly performance and operational efficiency. Unit mounts have also deteriorated over time leading to vibration issues in the system.

The College would like to replace the chiller, air handler, associated components and controls to ensure comfort levels of students, faculty and staff and to improve operational efficiency.

- Removal and disposal of (4) existing overhead doors, sawcutting and removal of existing concrete slab and steel bollards at Welding Lab door, and removal of existing metal panel wall system around Welding Lab door
- Installation of new concrete foundation, bollards, and steel framing as required to reduce size of door opening at Welding Lab
- Infill wall panel system around perimeter of Welding Lab Door
- Installation of (4) new insulated, electrically-operated overhead doors with appropriate perimeter seals

Programmatic Justification

Provide an explanation of the programmatic impact of the proposed project.

The configuration of the existing concrete block wall in relation to the overhead door within the welding area has created a safety hazard. The block wall runs perpendicular to the overhead door and if a person is in this space when the overhead door is closed, the person can become trapped within this area. Reconfiguration and replacement of the door and adjacent wall construction is necessary to safely protect students and staff.

Additionally, the other three doors (two in the auto department and one in warehousing) require replacement to be in compliance with current overhead door safety requirements and to provide increased energy efficiency by improving insulation properties and seals.

Cash Farm #8842 Lease Renewal – 2016 and 2017

The College entered into a four-year cash farm lease with Chris Kolodziej on November 19, 2013. The lease was for 149 acres at \$380/acre, an annual lease payment of \$56,620. Crop year 2017 is the final year of the four-year lease. The lease is renewed annually to preserve both the rights of the College and the lessee.

Mr. Kolodziej approached the administration and asked that we consider lowering the rent due to low commodity prices. He can plant seed corn on 66 of the 149 acres every other year and would be willing to pay \$350/acre for the 66 acres those years and pay \$300/acre on the remaining 83 acres. This would make the annual lease payment for 2016 (seed corn year) \$48,000. The administration feels this is a fair request. In 2013, the next highest bid came in at \$278/acre.

Recommendations:

- 1. The administration recommends Board approval to revise the lease with Chris Kolodziej to \$350 per acre on 66 acres and \$300 per acre for the remaining 83 acres for an annual lease payment of \$48,000 for 2016.
- 2. The administration recommends Board approval to revise the lease with Chris Kolodziej to \$300 per acre for 149 acres for an annual lease payment of \$44,700 for 2017.

KPI 5: Fiscal Responsibility/Affordability

Student Support Services - Project Success - Local Match

As part of the grant application, the College agreed to provide a local match of \$10,000 annually for the five-year period of the grant FY2016 – FY2020 for the federal Student Support Services (TRiO) grant. One of the grant conditions requires a local match of one-third of the dollars provided for student aid (tuition waivers).
