Accommodations at Illinois Valley Community College

Accommodations are determined on a case-by-case basis based on each person's needs. Common academic accommodations and supports may include, but are not limited to:

- Extended test time
- Separate testing location
- Note taking supports
- Test readers
- Assistive technology

Who is eligible for CAN services at IVCC?

You may be eligible for services and/or academic accommodations if you have a condition that affects your ability to learn, such as a:

- History of receiving special education services with an IEP or a 504 plan
- Documented learning difference, such as a learning disability, ADD or ADHD, or Autism.
- Sensory, physical, or psychiatric condition, such as anxiety or depression, that affects your ability to learn
