Will Wallace and Other LaSalle County Soldiers

Explore the history of Ottawa's home town General Will Wallace, who fought in the Mexican War and the Civil War. His family came to LaSalle County from Ohio when he was 13. He became an attorney with T. Lyle Dickey. After Fort Sumter was attacked, he enlisted, formed a regiment, and arrived in Springfield within 12 days. He rose in rank quickly after the Fort Donelson victory. He was mortally wounded at the battle of Shiloh, and succumbed four days later with his wife at his side, a touching love story. We will also mention the Civil War camps in Ottawa, and the many units of local men who passed through, and some who didn't come home.

NEW! IVCC Bus Trip Exploring the Horicon Marsh

Includes motorcoach transportation, guided pontoon boat tour, lunch, visit to The Explorium, gratuities and snacks.

The 33,000 acre Horicon Marsh National Wildlife Refuge in Wisconsin is the largest freshwater cattail marsh in the United States. Over 300 species of birds can be found at Horicon Marsh throughout the year. Fall brings the most impressive numbers of migrating ducks, sandhill cranes and Canada geese for viewing. An occasional

sighting of a rare Whooping Crane is possible. We will board a pontoon boat as we explore the Horicon Marsh. Knowledgeable guides will point out points of interest and wildlife that may be viewable. A box lunch is included.

This afternoon, enjoy a self-guided tour of The Explorium where you can tour the Horicon Marsh through time, from the Ice Age to present day, through narrated interactive exhibits. Long before Horicon Marsh achieved international status as an important bird and wildlife area and a destination for outdoor recreation, glaciers carved a basin where a wetland would one day form. Today, guests of The Explorium can get a glimpse of life at the Horicon Marsh thousands of years before European settlement and witness how the current wetland became to be. The experience is narrated by a Clovis spearpoint, who keeps you company

throughout the journey as you view, listen to, touch and even smell exhibits that document the changes to the marsh over time. Be sure to bring your binoculars! A day in Wisconsin would not be complete without a stop for cheese! You will have some free time at a local purveyor of Wisconsin delights.

The Nell's Foundation has been made possible through the inspiration and generous support of former Ottawan Mr. James Downey. Located at 2000 Alexis Avenue on 58 acres of beautiful oak woodland preserve, his contributions have allowed the creation of an engaging and evolutionary place.
