



Bill (William) Arkins, at 94 years young, recently embarked on a day trip with his daughter, Peggy Miskowiec, coordinated through the IVCC Continuijng Education Center. Their destination: Baraboo, Wisconsin, where they explored the International Crane Foundation and the New Life Lavender Farm. The trip reminded him of a trip he and his wife, Kaye, took to the lavender fields of Provence. For Bill, being on campus and participating in an IVCC lifelong learning program brought back memories of the time he attended LPO Junior College, 76

years ago.

Bill Árkins grew up in the river town of LaSalle, where he attended St. Patrick's

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School and later St. Bede Academy. Encouraged by his mother, he enrolled at LPO Junior College in 1947. Reflecting on his time there, Bill fondly recalled, "It was the best thing I ever did." His mother's advice was clear:

"If you get your degree in pharmacy, you can go anywhere."

This wisdom propelled Bill toward a future filled with promise and opportunity. At LPO, Bill learned the value of diligent study and perseverance. He and his classmates often utilized a study room on the second floor, just outside the library. "My professors were very good and down to earth," he remembered. Inspired by his chemistry teacher, and encouraged by his accounting teacher, Bill felt that LPO provided a solid foundation for his future career. "I feel I got a great education, and it was a great transition," he said.

University Life and Early Career

Bill's academic journey continued at the University of Illinois Chicago's Circle Campus; during this time he worked in the pharmacy at the renowned Drake Hotel. There, he encountered movie stars, sports teams, and even the head of Montgomery Wards. Despite living in a modest 12' x 6' room and managing on a tight budget, Bill embraced these experiences with enthusiasm. His adventures extended beyond the classroom. He fondly recalled dancing the night away to the Johnnie Kaye Orchestra at Washington School for just a dollar. He applied to the Coast Guard Academy but was drafted into the Army during the Korean War. There, he joined an intelligence division known as the "Grey Flannel School." One of his most memorable assignments was interviewing a cabinet member from Harry Truman's administration.

Family and Legacy

After his military service, he returned home, when his father fell ill, to run the family pharmacy in Oglesby, continuing a legacy with Arkins Pharmacy for several decades. It was at this pharmacy that Bill met his future wife, Kaye (Harl) Arkins. Their serendipitous meeting over twenty cents worth of peanuts blossomed into a beautiful marriage that lasted 67 years. Together, they raised six children: Peggy, Jill, Tim, Amy, Pat, and Brian, and were blessed with thirteen grandchildren. Four of Bill's children have attended IVCC, and his brother, James, and sister, Fern, were graduates of LPO Junior College in the 30's.

Reflections and Future Plans

Bill reminisced about his time at LPO, cherishing the friendships he made with schoolmates like Jack Tauscher, Norlyn Allison, Don Baker, Evelyn Moyle, Robert Mueller, Frank Lecocq and twins Bill and Frank Vlastnik. "We never forgot where we came from. They were nice guys," he said, reflecting on the camaraderie that persisted despite the challenges of wartime.

Today, Bill remains active and curious about the world around him. He is contemplating a trip along the Columbia River or up the Pacific Coast. When asked about the secret to his longevity, Bill attributed it to "clean living, religion, believing in something, keeping moving, and keeping your mind active."

As Bill Arkins looks back on his remarkable journey, from his formative years at LPO Junior College to his enduring legacy with Arkins Pharmacy, he remains a testament to the power of education, hard work, and unwavering optimism. His story is a reminder that life's most extraordinary adventures often begin with a simple step forward, guided by the wisdom of those who believe in us.

Class B 40-Hour Course

Students will be expected to demonstrate the proper preparation, handling, safety, and driving skills necessary to pass the Commercial Driver's License (CDL) Driving Examination. This course will involve yard work, pre-trip and driving on city street and highways. You must be at least 18 years old, hold a valid driver license, meet the medical requirements of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulation and hold a current CDL Permit. In addition, you must pass a drug screen and provide a motor vehicle report. Participants will need to provide Class B truck for inspection before class start date.

40-Hour Equipment Refresher

This program includes 40-hours of hands-on, onthe-road driving equipment and a review of class A commercial driver's license requirements. This program is intended for past CDL Class A holders that need to retest/renew their license at the DMV. Participants must have a current DOT physical, drug screen, motor vehicle report and a Class A learner permit. A driving test is required to qualify for the refresher program.

Online Hazmat Certification

This course will cover the varies areas of hazardous materials and the intent of the regulation. Topics will include hazardous material transporting; communication rules; bulk packaging loading and unloading; driving and parking rules; emergencies; as well as terminology. Practical experience will be shared. This course meets the Federal Motor Carrier Administration requirement for all CDL holders to have proof of hazardous material training before they can add the endorsement to their license. Participants will receive a certificate of completion upon passing the final exam with an 80% or higher.

OSHA and Safety

Exploring the Horicon Marsh



Includes motorcoach transportation, quided pontoon boat tour, lunch, visit to The Explorium, gratuities and snacks. The 33,000 acre Horicon Marsh National Wildlife Refuge in Wisconsin is the largest freshwater cattail marsh in the United States. Over 300 species of birds can be found at Horicon Marsh throughout the year. Fall brings the most impressive numbers of migrating ducks, sandhill cranes and Canada geese for viewing. An occasional sighting of a rare Whooping Crane is possible. We will board a pontoon boat as we explore the Horicon Marsh. Knowledgeable guides will point out points of interest and wildlife that may be viewable. Lunch is included at a local favorite restaurant. This afternoon, enjoy a self-guided tour of The Explorium where you can tour the Horicon Marsh through time, from the Ice Age to present day, through narrated interactive exhibits. Long before Horicon Marsh achieved international status as an important bird and wildlife area and a destination for outdoor recreation, glaciers carved a basin where a wetland would one day form. Today, guests of The Explorium can get a glimpse of life at the Horicon Marsh thousands of years before European settlement and witness how the current wetland became to be. The experience is narrated by a Clovis spearpoint, who keeps you company throughout the journey as you view, listen to, touch and even smell exhibits that document the changes to the marsh over time. Be sure to bring your binoculars! A day in Wisconsin would not be complete without a stop for cheese! You will have some free time at a local purveyor of Wisconsin delights.
