### **Course Outcomes and Competencies**

- To compare and contrast the cultural and stylistic developments in art and architecture during the periods beginning with the European Renaissance through Modernism.
  - 1.1 -Students will be able to identify significant ideas, events, and persons that influenced the art during the cultural periods examined in the course.
  - 1.2 -Students will be able to identify specific stylistic characteristics from each cultural period discussed in the course.
  - 1.3 -Students will be able to recognize similar subject matters representative of the interests and values of each cultural period.
  - 1.4 -Students will be able to discuss the underlying themes of significant artworks from each cultural period.
- 2. To introduce the student to the process of critical analysis and its application to the verbal and written examination of art.
  - 2.1 -Students will be able to write a detailed description of artworks based on their own observations.
  - 2.2 -Students will be able to discuss the compositional relationships of visual elements in an artwork.
  - 2.3 -Students will be able to form and express an opinion on the thematic content of an artwork.
  - 2.4 -Students will be able to form and express a value judgement about artworks.
  - 2.5 -Students will be able to perform a critical analysis in both written and oral formats of presentation.
- 3. To develop the student's ability to visually identify stylistic characteristics of the art of specific cultural periods and individual artists.
  - 3.1- Students will be able to define and understand the elements of style.
  - 3.2 -Students will be able to identify innovations in artistic style and subject matter made by artists in the cultural periods discussed.
  - 3.3 -Students will be able to recognize stylistic characteristics of certain individual artists representative of the various cultural periods covered in the course.
- 4. To develop the student's ability to discuss artistic concepts, which illustrate humanity's concept and perception of the individual, society, and the environment.
