

SPOTLIGHT ON SURGICAL TECH SUCCESS

With a passion for healthcare and a dedication to helping others, Surgical **Technician student Sydney** Solsberry has emerged as a standout in the program. She completed the Surgical Technician program at IVCC in Fall 2024, and her journey through the rigorous curriculum and hands-on training has been marked by resilience, precision, and an unwavering commitment to excellence. Sydney is currently advancing her skills through training at **OSF**, where she continues to demonstrate her dedication to patient care and surgical excellence.

What inspired you to pursue a career as a Surgical Technician, and how did you decide to enroll in IVCC's program?

I was working as a medical office assistant, but I wanted to do more than take vitals and talk to patients. I wanted to be more involved in patient care. When I learned about IVCC's Surgical Technician program, it seemed like the perfect opportunity to enter a hands-on, fast-paced field.

Can you describe your experience in the Surgical Tech program at IVCC? What were the most valuable skills you learned?

The hands-on training was the most valuable part of the program. **Rachel Warner**, our instructor, brought in real surgical supplies, like sutures and instruments, which helped me build confidence in my skills. The bookwork was important too, but the hands-on practice really prepared me for the job.

How did the hands-on training and observations prepare you for your role at OSF?

Without the hands-on training, I wouldn't have known how to properly pass instruments, load sutures, or drape a patient. The

training has also helped me understand how things work in an actual operating room.

Were there any challenges you faced during the program, and how did you overcome them?

Yes, it was a challenging time for me. I was balancing school with personal responsibility and struggles - getting married, losing my aunt and dog. I had to juggle everything while still focusing on my studies. My instructor was very understanding and even offered to let me take my final later, but I pushed through and completed it on time.

What was your favorite part of the program, and why?

My favorite part was the last hands-on final with Rachel. It really tested everything I had learned, and it felt like a big accomplishment to complete it.

How did it feel to transition from student to training, to about to be a professional in the surgical field?

It was scary at first because I didn't want to make mistakes. In class, you have room to learn, but in the

Operating Room, real patients are relying on you. Luckily, my preceptor at OSF has been amazing - she remembers what it's like to be new and has been incredibly supportive.

Vanessa and Karla at OSF have also been great mentors.

Can you walk us through a typical day in your role as a Surgical Technician at OSF?

Right now, I'm in training through OSF's stipend program. It includes six months of orientation - three weeks in Peoria and the rest at the OSF I80 locations. I work under a preceptor who guides me through procedures. One of the most memorable moments so far was assisting in a cesarean section and seeing twins being born!

How do you feel IVCC's program prepared you for the responsibilities and challenges of your job?

Illinois Valley Community College's program did a great job preparing me. Rachel was very thorough, and since she also works at OSF, she knew exactly what to emphasize. She made sure we focused on sterile technique, which is crucial. The only thing I wish we had more of was one-on-one hands-on training since our class size was fairly large.

What advice would you give to future students considering the Surgical Tech program at IVCC?

Take advantage of every hands-on opportunity, and don't be afraid to ask questions. If you can do extra observations or shadowing, do it! Also, be prepared for a fast-paced environment - it's challenging but rewarding.

Where do you see yourself in your career in the next five years, and how has this program shaped your goals?

I can definitely see myself staying in the surgical field long-term. It's a completely different world from what I was doing before, but I love it! I'm planning to take my certification exam once I get the required scrubbed-in hours. I also want to continue growing professionally - every day, my preceptor is helping me become a better surgical tech, and I want to keep improving so I can provide the best care for patients.
