The following courses must be completed before ECE 2220: ECE 1000 - Introduction to ECE; ECE 1201 - Child Guidance, Child Study; ECE 1202 - Foundations/Trends for Infants/Toddlers/Twos; ECE 1203 - Creative Activities; ECE 1204 – DAP for Infants, Toddlers, Twos; ECE 2202 - Curriculum Programming; ECE 2207 – Observation/Assessment; ECE 2208 - Language Development.

A minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 is required before enrolling in ECE 2219. Students must earn a C or above in all courses. Petitioned approval by the ECE Program Coordinator is required the semester prior to internships. All forms must be completed prior to registering.

ECE Licensure Endorsement Certificate (18 credit hours)

This certificate is intended for students who already have their Professional Educator License (PEL) and are pursuing their ECE Endorsement through the Illinois State Board of Education. Students go through their ELIS account to apply for their endorsement. ISBE will issue a deficiency letter identifying which content areas are missing. Upon completion of all content areas and passage of the ECE Content Area exam, students apply to ISBE for the ECE Endorsement.
