It can be very difficult for junior-level transfers to complete the program in 2 years after transfer, therefore a sophomore-level transfer, if possible, should be considered. Completion of all UIUC's Campus Wide General Education requirements strongly recommended prior to transfer. Additionally, C's or better are required in all other major and directed general education courses. See specific discipline for requirements. Completion of 30 credit hours and an established WIU GPA is required for formal admission to all teacher education programs. It is therefore advisable for IVCC students to take the above courses and additional general education coursework in their first year, and then transfer to WIU. #Students must take one Global Issues course or Foreign Lang of 3yrs in HS or 3 coll. sem and one Multicultural Studies course. Courses may double dip Gen Ed/Global or Multi/Global but NOT Gen Ed/Multi, some majors at WIU incorporate the Global Issues course in the lower/ upper level curriculum.
