## APA Style Formatting

### In-Text Citations

In-text citations make brief reference to the complete citations in your reference list

- An in-text citation includes the author's family name and the year of publication. E.g., (Cohen, 2017).
- You may place an in-text citation in parentheses at the end of a sentence or incorporate the author's name into the text of your sentence as a narrative citation. For example:
  - Parenthetical: (Cohen, 2017)
  - Narrative: Cohen (2017) found that...
- Include page numbers only when you are quoting or referring to specific passages. E.g., (Cohen, 2017, p. 22).

### Reference Entry Template

**Standalone Work (Webpage, Book, Video, etc...):** Last Name, First Initial. (Year of Publication). *Name of book/article/video/webpage/etc.* Publisher. URL or DOI

**Contained Work (Journal Article, etc...):** Last Name, First Initial. (Year of Publication). Name of contained work. *Container Such as a Journal or Textbook*, edition, page range. Publisher. URL or DOI
