MLA Style Formatting

In-Text Citations

In-text citations make brief reference to the complete citations in your reference list

- An in-text citation includes the author’s family name and the page number you are using information from e.g., (Maran 25).
- You may place all information of an in-text citation in parentheses at the end of a sentence **or** incorporate the author’s name into the text of your sentence and include the page numbers at the end. For example:
 - Parenthetical: (Maran 9)
 - Narrative: Maran discovered in their research that... (9).
- Include In-Text citations in all sentences using a direct quote or at the end of a section of paraphrased sentences.

Last Name, First Name. Name of *Book*/"Article"/*Video*/"webpage"/etc. *Container*, Other Contributors, Version, Number, Publisher, Publication Date, URL or DOI.
